



# The basics of climate and the private sector:

The private sector is a large contributor to climate change as well as a critical part of the solution. How can parliamentarians understand this opportunity and provide a clear legislative framework to enrol business into building a sustainable future?

# **Global climate governance of the private sector:**

The global matrix of mechanisms to govern private sector sustainability can be a confusing landscape. How do we navigate the spectrum of voluntary initiatives and legally binding standards? One way is to balance inspiration and predictability. This video encourages policymakers to bring the aspirations of non-binding standards into the creation of mandatory climate governance within their geographies.

# Standards, measurements, and reporting in the private sector:

More and more companies are reporting their climate risks and opportunities according to global standards, and that's a good thing. However, national reporting expectations are often still unclear. Parliamentarians can learn from countries like Singapore and New Zealand that have embedded global standards into local legislation to give companies the clarity they need. This video introduces the two key global disclosure standards that can help us do the same.

# How can business be an ally in accelerating climate action?

Clear state leadership and strategic support for sustainability are a sure way to unlock solutions from the private sector. Parliamentarians can work with business by shaping a policy framework that clearly points away from fossil fuels and provides grants and capital to support promising sustainability initiatives to scale.

## How can legislation and policies enable private sector climate action?

What can parliamentarians do to get companies moving in the right direction? It is important to introduce laws and policies that reward sustainable companies while penalizing those that are dragging their feet. This could look like cancelling fossil fuel subsidies, mandating emissions disclosure, and introducing carbon pricing, among other options. There is no shortage of levers available to encourage change.








#### Video 2







- 5. How can legislation and policies enable private sector climate action? provides an of overview of impactful moves that parliamentarians can make to drive private sector action.




